WORKS Swap and Market

Here's some news from our Swap Master, Tom Hapner! Many of you know that I like to buy and sell at several swap meets in our area during the fall and winter months. To that end I monitor Facebook for airplanes and related items I can pick up and resell at these meets. Two weeks ago, I saw a post pop up for a room full of very dirty airplanes.



Among the comments of trash and offers of bonfires was one post about these being special. So I took a chance and commented about wanting to look at them before making an offer. The original post was looking for a thousand dollars. The poster then contacted me thru private chat and agreed to have me come look at them. The address they sent me was 400 South Indiana Street Hobart In. The address did not immediately register until later that evening. Then when it did come to me I ran downstairs to find my control line plans for the Midwest Products profile P40 that I printed last week. There it was on the plans.... I was going to Midwest Products.... I felt like Charlie, and I had just been given the Golden Ticket. So, on the following Monday I traveled the 3.5 hours to Hobart and met Paul King. Paul has been with Midwest for a little over 10 years. His wife has been with Midwest for almost 40 years. Their nephew in law just recently purchased the company to keep it open in Hobart. They still manufacture some of the highest quality balsa sheet and strip here and the also now make items for the home and garden markets. My visit there allowed me to tour the plant and meet many of the people that have brought joy to thousands of kids over the years. It was truly a visit that I will cherish the rest of my life. The airplanes I had come up to see have been hanging in the plant for almost 40 years. When they began to fall randomly, they took them all down and put into a part of the plant that has not been used in years.

So these airplanes are the prototypes and camera models that were produced by paid model makers and engineers at the company during their rather long history of making model aircraft and boat kits. If Midwest made it there is a very good chance, I have one or three of them. In an agreement between the current owner of Midwest and Myself they are
